An angel is a symbol of love and joy, guardians who watch over us and point us towards our Heavenly Father, we would like to leave lots of angels around Cudham and Downe for people to find as we journey through Advent to arrive at the joy of Christmas Day.

We would like to start leaving the angels in Cudham and Downe from Sunday 28th November (Advent Sunday) and it would be super if you would like to join us in making some. The attached knitting pattern is for beginner knitters so us Archers are going to be trying that one!

Simple Knitting Pattern for an Angel

The angel should be about 10cm tall.

What you will need:

Some double knitting wool (any yarn or colour)

Knitting needles size 10 – 8 (3.25mm – 4mm)
depending on your tension

Darning needle for sewing up

Small amount of stuffing for the head



You will need a basic knowledge of knit and purl, but don't let that stop you if you haven't done it before. It's never too late to learn a new skill.

Angel's Body

Cast on 48 stitches

| 15 | (Knit 2 together, Knit 6) 4 times | 28 |
| 16 | Purl | |

| 18 | (Purl 2 together, Purl 5) 4 times | 24 |
| 19 | Knit | |
| 20 | Purl | |
| 21 | (Knit 2 together, Knit 4) 4 times | 20 |
| 22 | Purl | |
| 23 | Knit | |
| 24 | Purl | |
| 25 | Knit | |
| 26 | Purl | |
| 27 | Knit | |
| 28 | (If you want a different colour for the head, change now.) Purl | |
| 29 | Knit | |
| 30 | Purl | |
| 31 | Knit | |
| 32 | Purl | |
| 33 | Knit | |
| 34 | Purl | |
| 35 | Knit 2 together across the whole row | 10 |
| 36 | Purl | |
| 37 | Knit | |
| 38 | Purl 2 together across the whole row | 5 |
| | Using a darning needle, thread the end of the yarn through the stitches and tighten to create the top of the head. Turn the angel inside out and sew up the head and the body. | |
| | Thread some yarn through the stitches, like a drawstring, around the neck. Put a small amount of stuffing in the head, pull the drawstring tight and sew in the ends to create the head. | |

Angel's Wings

Cast on 27 stitches

| Row | | Stitches |
|------|---|----------|
| 1 | Knit | |
| 2 | Knit | |
| 3 | Knit 2 together, knit to last 2 stitches, knit 2 together | 25 |
| 4 | Knit | |
| 5 | Knit 2 together, knit to last 2 stitches, knit 2 together | 23 |
| 6-15 | Repeat row 5 until you have 3 stitches left | |
| 16 | Knit 3 stitches together, pass end of yarn through the last stitch | |
| | Sew the wings to the back of your angel. Twist or crochet a chain for the halo, secure in place. Cut a length of yarn about 15cm long, thread through the top of the head for a loop so that your angel can hang on the Christmas tree. | |
