

St Peter & St Paul Cudham



St Peter & St Paul has been here, in the centre of our village for over 700 years. It has watched as the village has been through plague, civil war and two World Wars. It has been a constant presence in times of trouble and sadness, times of celebration and gladness and for funerals, christenings and weddings.

Yet it is more than a historic building. We are here as a Church which lives in the present and looks to the future. As the Bible tells us, our Church is primarily not a building but a body of people - people who relate together as the Body of Christ. The Church is a living organism, and lives to reflect that we believe in and serve a living God who is concerned about our lives today.

The upkeep of our church – both the fabric and the ministry – is entirely the responsibility of our small congregation. We receive no funding whatsoever from either the central Church of England or government, and if we want our church to be there for future generations we have to continue to bear that responsibility.

Why should we give money to the Church?

Our giving of both money and time supports the mission of God in the world – both here in Cudham and further afield.

We give to the church because we see God's abundant generosity in the world around us.

As disciples of Christ we want to put God first in our lives. In our giving that generous abundance from God flows through us to enable that church to flourish.

This year's budget

When we think about our giving to God through his church it is helpful to understand that every church has to fund itself, and to know how much we receive, and what we spend it on each month.

What about the money we pay to the Diocese?

How much money should we give?

The New Testament teaches us to be generous in giving to God. Many Christians follow the Old Testament norm of 10% when considering their giving across the spectrum of their local church and other Christian causes. Not everyone, of course, can manage that amount. So we simply ask you please to consider prayerfully how much you are able to give to St Peter & St Paul.

Think about planned giving

Many of our church family give a set amount to the church each week, month or year, usually by standing order.

As a parish we have joined the Parish Giving Scheme, which enables us to give by Direct Debit. If you sign up to this you will make a big difference to your church's finances.
