Online Guided Retreat

For those who feel drawn to spending more time in prayer at this time of self-isolation, an online guided retreat has been organised by the Diocese's Coordinator of Spirituality, Rev Canon Susanne Carlsson. You are simply encouraged to put aside some time each day for prayer. Then you will be paired with a spiritual accompanier, who will either phone you, or make contact via computer, at the same time each day for 20–30 minutes. The intention is for you to listen to God through praying with scripture and in talking and reflecting with your accompanier; they will listen and may suggest various scripture passages for you to use. The dates and length of the retreat will be flexible between the 27th April – 8th May and it will be up to you to arrange with the spiritual accompanier the dates and times you meet.
