Annual Report Of the Parochial Church Council For the year 1st January to 31st December 2022

Background – aim and purpose

The PCC of St Mary's Church has the responsibility of cooperating with the Incumbent in promoting in the ecclesiastical parish the whole mission of the church: pastoral, evangelical, social and ecumenical. St Mary's is part of a United Benefice with St Peter and St Paul, Cudham.

The Mission Statement

The mission statement of the church agreed by the PCC is: "We exist for three main purposes: Worship, Witness and Welcome:

- To worship the living God through the Lord Jesus Christ;
- To witness to the love of Christ shown supremely in his life, death and resurrection; and

To welcome all people into our fellowship with the love of Christ."

The PCC is responsible for the care and upkeep of the Downe Cemetery churchyard extension in High Elms Road.

Structure, Governance and management

Rev Rach Archer continued as Curate in the Benefice but will be leaving the Benefice during January 2023 to take up the post of Rector of Mossley Hill Church in Liverpool.

PCC – the method of appointment of PCC members is set out in the Church Representation Rules. At St Mary's, Downe the membership of the PCC consists of the incumbent (our vicar), churchwarden/s, treasurer, secretary, deanery synod representative and members elected by those who are on the electoral role of the church. All those who attend our services /members of the congregation are encouraged to register on the Electoral Roll and stand for election to the PCC.

PCC and the Standing Committee. The Standing Committee can meet between full meetings of the PCC and consists of the Incumbent, Churchwardens, Treasurer and Secretary and two other members of the PCC. It has power to transact any urgent business of the PCC, subject to any directions given by the Council.

Membership – members of the PCC are either ex-officio or elected by the APCM. Since 2004 the total number of members elected to the PCC is 6, or 1/10th of the Electoral Roll, whichever is the larger number. A further 2 people may be co-opted for a year. One third of those elected on the Council retire from office each year and are eligible for reelection. The following served on the PCC:
