#### **Churchwardens Report**

We have met with the architect to discuss our requirements for the improvements to the vestry and provision of a WC. He is now working on plans so the process is ongoing.

I also wish Rachel many blessings and much happiness for the whole Archer family as she takes up her role of Rector of St Matthews, Mossley Hill in Liverpool. I pray God richly blesses her ministry.

I meet regularly with the vicar to discuss many aspects of day to day church life and would like to convey my thanks and gratitude to Barbara, our administrator for all that she does to help me with ongoing admin tasks.

## **Churchyard and Buildings**

The churchyard gate that was taken away for repair in February 2021 was finally restored in August. This was only after Councillor Jonathan Andrews took up the case for us. However, the new post did not match the one that was taken away and was too thin, so the gate did not close. Councillor Jonathan Andrews got back in touch with Idverde and they added a piece to the post, so the gate now closes. However we still have the issue that the post is not the same as the old one. Councillor Jonathan Andrews continues to chase on our behalf to get a replacement post that matches the old one.

Parts of the churchyard wall are crumbing and some of the fencing is falling down. This was reported to Bromley Council and Idverde but to date repairs have not taken place. Councillor Jonathan Andrews has also taken this up on our behalf and has advised that Idverde "will seek advice from LBB Property for these works to be undertaken". We are still awaiting the outcome of their conversation.

Messy Church met on 5 occasions during 2022:

- 30<sup>th</sup> August, on the theme of Pilgrimage at Cudham,
- 28<sup>th</sup> October, a Halloween Light Party at Downe,

- In addition, at the last moment, we had to cancel the event on 18th February 2022, on the theme of Love, at Downe, due to a dangerous storm which was accompanied by a Met Office red warning of not to travel!

Attendance varied during the year, with an average of around 14 children accompanied by their parents or carers, of which the majority do not attend church on a regular basis. The most popular was the Halloween Light Party with 22 children in attendance. We continue to have a core of regular attendees although there are usually one or two new families at each session. It is a delight to potentially be introducing them to a life with Jesus Christ.

Rev John Musson, Rev Rach Archer or Kim and John Curle led all age worship on each occasion, and it was marvellous to be able to offer an amazing buffet and refreshments at all these events once again, with the exception of Good Friday when hot cross buns were provided! *cont'd/...* 

A donation box was made available, however, cash donations were small and did not cover the costs of the hall hire (at Downe), food or craft materials. However, some groups brought a contribution of food as a donation instead which is always welcomed.
