The design for the window in memory of James Kenneth Roe of Petleys kindly donated by Dame Marion Roe DBE, is by Stained Glass Artist David Griffiths ASMGP. The overall theme of the window is based on the concept of Service.

In Mark 10:45 Jesus said "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many' - this is the guiding verse for the design with the central image that of Jesus washing his disciple Peter's feet with the text from John 13:15 'I have set you an example that you should do what I have done for you.'

Service is expressed in many other ways throughout the window: The village of Downe itself is shown as a source of leisure for Londoners who come to Downe on weekends to relax and re-charge, and the capital in turn is there to serve the wider country through government and commerce (the Houses of Parliament and the Guildhall).

Downe Primary school serves the local community in educating the next generation, and the inclusion of the Tree of Life drawing and Down House hint at the contribution to science made by Downe's most celebrated resident, Charles Darwin.

The coats of arms in the window speak of service, too: They are those of Downe School, and of the donors, members of the Roe family, and residents of the village of Downe since 1969, who all serve or served in public office. Dame Marion was created Dame Commander of the British Empire by the then Labour Speaker of the House in recognition – at least in part - for her work to outlaw female genital mutilation. She continues to be active with many charities in efforts to ensure the inclusion of child health policies in government policy.

As the window was designed and made during 2020-2023, the rainbow echoes all those who served during the Covid Pandemic, and the Ukrainian Flag is there too, painted by student Yelizaveta Smirnova. We pray for peace in that country.

Service is thus shown in the example set to us by Christ serving his followers, as well as in the places that serve the nation through government and commerce, and in the places to make us fit for service through education and leisure, and finally in the armorials recognizing service to the community.
